





ORGANISATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS



The Board of Governors of Saint Mary's Primary School supported by the Catholic Council for Maintained Schools (CCMS), the Southern Education and Library Board (SELB) and the Education and Training Inspectorate take responsibility for the smooth running of the school.


During the school year the Board of Governors must meet at least three times per year. They receive up to date reports by the Principal and discuss and direct school business. The governors wish to take this opportunity to thank CCMS and the SELB for their muchvalued support throughout the year.

What are the main responsibilities of the Board of governors?

The Governors are ultimately responsible for the overall management of the school. Some of their duties and responsibilities are:

- 1 Overseeing of the curriculum
- 2 The control of the budget
- 3 The provision of information to parents
- 4 The appointment and dismissal of staff
- 5 The maintenance of the premises (shared with SELB)
- 6 Fostering links with the local community and pursuing objectives of mutual understanding
- 7 Discipline and control.

THE CURRICULUM AND STAFF DEVELOPMENT



Under the Education Reform Order the responsibility of Governors for the curriculum i.e. what is taught in the school, has been increased. The day-to-day organisation of the curriculum remains the Principal's responsibility. The governors' control of the curriculum is, however, determined by legislation.


It is our responsibility to ensure that a broad and balanced learning experience is provided for all pupils. The school continues to develop its curriculum provision; policies have now been completed in a wide range of subjects and will be reviewed where necessary.

As part of our development plan for 2012-13 teachers have been engaged in a range of initiatives which were supported by in-service training programmes. These have included:

Curriculum and Management;

- 1. LITERACY Coordinator to look at Framework for each class and overall planning audit. Close monitoring of linguistic/spelling progress Completed
- 2. NUMERACY Time allocated for mental maths each day Completed
- 3. Assessment of the Cross Curricular Skills Training and impact on T/L Completed
- World Around Us Audit of current practice planning, resourcing, time devoted – Begin to look at new topics which will embrace a strong science/technology theme allowing for TSPC to be developed Ongoing
- 5. ASSESSMENT: Target Setting Looking at SEN, under achievers and over achievers IQ and Standardised Scores Completed
- 6. ICT Accreditation P4-P7 Consolidate what was achieved in P4-7 in 2011/12 and disseminate to other classes. Completed

We have continued to develop skills and resources in Information and Communication Technology throughout the year. Recent equipment has included two new Apple ipads and a New Interactive White Board. All classrooms have access to the internet and appropriate software to support the curriculum.



All teaching staff participated in "Performance Review and Staff Development". This entailed all teaching staff setting targets which were closely monitored throughout the year.

We worked closely with members of the CASS advisory and support services of the SELB throughout the year and value the high standard of service provided




ATTENDANCE


Extra Curricular Experiences in St. Mary's Primary school, Granemore


